

2008 Tax Schools Sponsored By UA Extension Service

LITTLE ROCK, ARK.

The University of Arkansas Division of Agriculture is offering two-day income tax schools around the state. The classes are open to professional tax preparers, farmers, small business owners and anyone else interested in preparing income taxes.

Classes are in Harrison (October 30-31); Fayetteville (November 3-4); Fort Smith (November 6-7); Texarkana (November 10-11); Batesville (November 13-14); West Memphis (November 17-18); Monticello (November 20-21); Jonesboro (November 24-25); Hot Springs (December 1-2); and Little Rock (December 8-9).

Instructors are tax experts with Internal Revenue Service experience. Representatives with the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration will also conduct sessions.

Topics covered during the two-day session in-

clude individual taxpayer problems, IRS issues, ethics, small business matters, schedule K-1, investments, elder issues, death of a taxpayer, retirement concerns, entity issues, S corporations, like-kind exchange, agricultural matters, rulings and new legislation.

The 2008 income tax school meets the guidelines for 16 hours of continuing education units, including two hours of ethics, as set forth in the Rules and Regulations of the Arkansas State Board of Public Accountancy

The registration fee is \$210 for most of the courses, which includes tax manuals and reference materials. Registration fee is \$225 for the Batesville and Little Rock courses, which includes lunch both days as well as course materials.
